2 ???	Mystery Beer Number One	☺	4.3%	The first of our mystery beers. A couple of clues to help you. We've given you the ABV and the fact that it's classed as LocAle.
3 Abbeydale Sheffield	Black Mass		6.66%	Very dark ruby ale with a rich creamy head. Full bodied and warming with a lingering bitter finish.
4 Abbeydale Sheffield	Last Rites		11.0%	A premium brew, fantastically strong and unusually pale in colour. Please treat this beer with respect. It's earned it!

5	York	Yorkshire Terrier	4.2%	A premium bitter with a rich, creamy malt and full hop-palate finish. A big favourite at all the York Brewery pubs.
6	Cottage Lovington Somerset	MM	5.0%	Brother of Norman Conquest. This ale is dark and mature, full of fruit with a touch of bitterness.
7	Rudgate Tockwith York	Ruby Mild	4.4%	Champion Beer of Britain 2009. Always a popular drink at the Charnwood. A nutty, rich, ruby ale.
8	Anglo-Dutch Dewsbury	Devil's Knell (Vintage)	 4.8%	A reddish 'winter beer'. It's a real coup for the Charnwood to obtain some of last year's brew which was put aside to mature. For Knell, it's good.
9	???	Mystery Beer Number Two	4.2%	We reckon this is the hardest of our three mystery beers to come up with. It's not LocAle, but it is regularly available in the district.
10	Leeds West Yorks	Midnight Bell	 4.8%	A premium dark mild with crystal and chocolate malts. A multi-award winning ale.
11	Burton Bridge Burton upon Trent	Stairway to Heaven	5.0%	Golden, well balanced beer. The malty and hoppy start leads to a hoppy body with some astringency.
12	HB Clark Wakefield	Ram's Revenge	 4.6%	A rich ruby, dark copper coloured ale. Well balanced with roast barley and malt, it has a deep fruity taste. Especially ordered for sheepish people.
13	Timothy Taylor Keighley	Ram Tam	 4.3%	A dark beer that has a reputation as a "winter warmer". This mellow beer has body and depth leaving a pleasant, fruity afterglow.
14	Salopian Shrewsbury	Jailbird	4.5%	Golden, with a slightly citrus palate and smooth fruit flavours. Another new one to us.

15	Anglo-Dutch Dewsbury	Ghost on the Rim	 4.5%	A pale, full-bodied bitter with a citrus finish. One of the original Anglo-Dutch brews.
16	Leeds West Yorks	Hellfire	 5.2%	A fiery pale bitter. Choice hops and premium malt give a fruity, well balanced beer with a full, lasting bitterness.
17	Cottage Lovington Somerset	Old Freckled Ken	4.5%	Reportedly a bitter, but it's so new that we haven't tried it yet.
18	Oldershaw Grantham	Alchemy	5.3%	A golden premium beer, easy drinking for its strength, with good hop flavour and aroma from the First Gold hops.
19	Elland West Yorks	Nettlethrasher	 4.4%	Grainy, amber coloured beer. A mellow, nutty and fruity taste with a dry finish. Always a big favourite wherever it's available.
20	Tetley Leeds	Northern Cracker	 4.3%	A dark ale with a nutty flavour and a hint of vanilla. Carlsberg have reportedly commended the brewing team "in Leeds" on this product.
21	Anglo-Dutch Dewsbury	Wild Flower	 4.2%	Late-hopped with hop flowers from the gardens of Mike Field (Anglo) and Paul Klos (Dutch). A very refreshing ale.
22	Elland West Yorks	Diablo	 5.6%	A devilishly delicious porter. Smooth and dark with no less than seven different malts.
23	Everards Narborough Leics	Original	5.2%	Full-bodied, mid-brown, strong bitter with a pleasant, rich, grainy mouthfeel. We'd better serve it well. Rumour has it they're visiting the festival.
24	Copper Dragon Skipton	Black Gold	 3.7%	A dark ale with coffee flavours and a tangy fruit background. The finish is bitter and malty.
25	Moorhouse's Burnley	Blond Witch	4.5%	Moorhouse's first ever "Blond" ale, this beer is as light as you can get with a lager colour (minus the bubbles).
